In 1887, The Marion Water Works Company was established to provide water for non-drinking purposes to the city of Marion.

On June 1, 1915, Mayor Josiah Good approved an ordinance putting the creation of a public water and electrical system on the ballot for project funding.

On April 25, 1916 under the authority granted by Ordinance #447 the City of Marion Public Utilities began operation with Water & Electrical service being offered to the residents of Marion. In 1938, the first sewage treatment plant was added to the public utilities system.

Today, 100 Years later as our elected officials meet, we wish to recognize and thank all the people who have made this City and it's citizens so very successful.
